



#### TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + MEASURING TAPE

#### STEP | 01 LAYOUT AND INSTALL PREP

- 1.1 Install Rail Nuts: Slide (6) Rail Nuts into the passenger side factory roof rail (FIG 1), and (8) into the driver side rail. The extra two will be for either your Side Ladder or Side Ladder Access Cover.
- **1.2 Layout Rail Nuts:** Space out the **Rail Nuts** close to their final positions as roughly laid out in **FIG 3.**











#### TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 7/32" ALLEN WRENCH

#### **STEP | 02 SIDE RAIL INSTALL**

2.1 Install Side Rails: Beginning with the forward section of the rack (see FIG 5 for layout), start loosely attaching the side rails to the roof rails using the 3/8-16" Button Head Screws & 3/8" Lock Washers, but do not tighten them all the way down yet (FIG 4). If you are not installing a Side Ladder at this time, install the Side Ladder Access Cover in the location shown in FIG 5.









TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 3/16" ALLEN WRENCH + 7/16" SOCKET OR WRENCH

#### STEP | 02 SIDE RAIL INSTALL

2.2 Side Rail Connecting Plates: Install the Side Rail Connecting Plates to the locations shown in FIG 6 using (4ea) 1/4-20 x 0.75 Flanged Button Head Screws, Flat Washers and Nylon Locknuts to loosely join the Side Rails together (FIG 7).








#### TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 3/16" ALLEN WRENCH


#### STEP | 03 CROSSBAR INSTALL

**3.1 Layout Crossbar Locations:** Position the crossbars in your desired locations, loosely threading in the **1/4-20" Flange Head Screws** to hold in place **(FIG 8)**.

**NOTE -** Save a crossbar for Fairing Assembly in the next step.

**NOTE** - Keep in mind the layout of your roof top array (solar panels, fans, tents, etc.) You can mount crossbars in the set pair of holes (**FIG 9**), or you can place them in the slots which provides you more freedom of layout.









TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 5/32" ALLEN WRENCH

#### **STEP | 04 FAIRING ASSEMBLY**

- 4.1 Crossbar Fairing Bracket: Stack a 1/4-20" x 0.5 Button Head Screw, 1/4" Belleville Lock Washer and 1/4" Flat Washer as shown in FIG 10 and insert into the six available front holes of the Crossbar Fairing Bracket. Loosely assemble using a T-Nut. You'll only want to screw the T-Nuts on a little in order to provide clearance for the next step.
- **4.2 Crossbar Install:** Now, slide the **Crossbar** onto the **Crossbar Fairing Bracket**. You'll have to straighten each **T-Nut** as you go to get it to feed into the crossbar correctly **(FIG 11)**.











#### **STEP | 04 FAIRING ASSEMBLY**

- **4.3 Center Fairing Bracket:** Slide in the **Center Fairing Bracket** into place along the two center-most **1/4-20" Button Head Screws** of the **Crossbar Fairing Bracket** as shown in **FIG 12**.
- 4.4 Tighten Assembly: After sliding in the Center Fairing Bracket, tighten all six (6) of the 1/4-20" Button Head Screws in the Assembly.
- **4.5 Attach Front Fairing:** Attach the **Front Fairing** to the Assembly using **1/4-20** x **0.75 Flanged Button Head Screws, Flat Washers and Nylon Locknuts** (**FIG 13**).









TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 3/16" ALLEN WRENCH 7/16" WRENCH OR SOCKET

#### **STEP | 04 FAIRING ASSEMBLY**

**4.6 Driver and Passenger Side Fairing Brackets**: Attach the **Driver and Passenger Side Fairing Brackets** to the Assembly using **1/4-20** x **0.75 Flanged Button Head Screws, Flat Washers and Nylon Locknuts (FIG 14)**.

**4.7 Fairing Gasket Trim:** Attach the **Fairing Gasket Trim to the Front Fairing** in the orientation shown in **FIG 15.** Make sure the "bulbed" side is facing inward.









TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 3/16" ALLEN WRENCH

#### STEP | 05 FAIRING INSTALL

**5.1 Fairing Install:** Now you're ready to attach the fairing to the roof rack. Slide it in from the front and into the location shown in **FIG 16.** Tighten down using **(8) 1/4-20" Flange Head Screws (FIG 17).** 









TOOLS REQUIRED FOR THIS STEP: + 3/16" ALLEN WRENCH + 5/32" ALLEN WRENCH


#### STEP | 06 REAR SPOILER INSTALL

**6.1 Spoiler Assembly:** Stack a 1/4-20" x 0.5 Button Head Screw, 1/4" Belleville Lock Washer and 1/4" Flat Washer as shown in FIG 18 and insert into the ten available top holes of the Rear Spolier. Loosely assemble using a T-Nut. You'll only want to screw the T-Nuts on a little in order to provide clearance for the next step.

- **6.2 Crossbar Install:** Now, slide the **Crossbar** onto the **Rear Spoiler**. You'll have to straighten each **T-Nut** as you go to get it to feed into the **Crossbar** correctly **(FIG 19)**. After sliding the **Rear Spoiler** and **Crossbar** together, tighten all fasteners.
- **6.3 Fairing Install:** Now you're ready to attach the Rear Spoiler to the roof rack. Slide it in from the back and into the location shown in **FIG 20** and tighten down using **(8) 1/4-20" Flange Head Screws**.


#### STEP | 07 FINAL ADJUSTMENTS

**7.1 Tighten Crossbar Fasteners:** Tighten all crossbar bolts using the 3/16" Allen Wrench.

**NOTE -** Do not overtighten! If you are concerned about the bolts backing out, you can put a dab of blue loctite on the bolts before tightening down completely.

**7.2 Tighten Rail-to-Rail Fasteners:** Now tighten Side Rails to Roof Rail using the 7/32" allen key.

**7.3 Tighen Rail Connecting Plates:** Tighten all Rail Connecting Plates using the 3/16" Allen Wrench and a 7/16" Socket.
